Marienplatz with Old and New Town Hall and Glockenspiel 01

The classic starting point for exploring downtown. The famous carillon (Glockenspiel) in the tower of the New Town Hall has reverberated its chimes over the rooftops since 1908 and displays figures from the town’s history. To avoid a stiff neck, climb up the 85 m high town hall tower or snatch a seat in the Cafe Glockenspiel facing town hall (see p. 39).

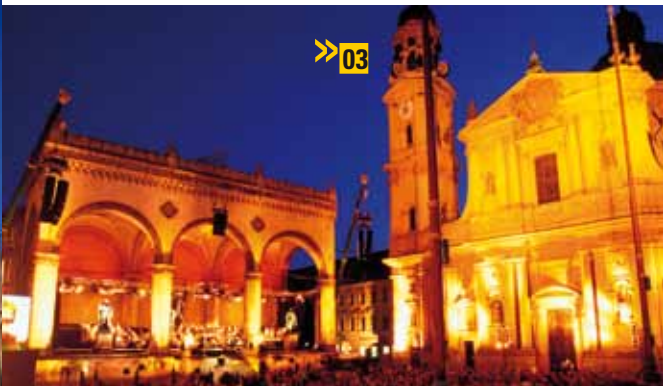

Pinakotheken and Museum Brandhorst 10

Art lovers needn't cover large distances in the Munich museum quarter. The Alte Pinakothek (paintings from the 14th to the 18th century) and the Neue Pinakothek (18th-20th centuries) are directly opposite the Pinakothek der Moderne (art from Klee to Picasso, design and architecture). The latter as well as the Museum Brandhorst just around the corner (contemporary art by Warhol, Hirst and Twombly) are also noteworthy due to their architectural design. **Tip:** On Sundays the admission fee is only Euro 1!

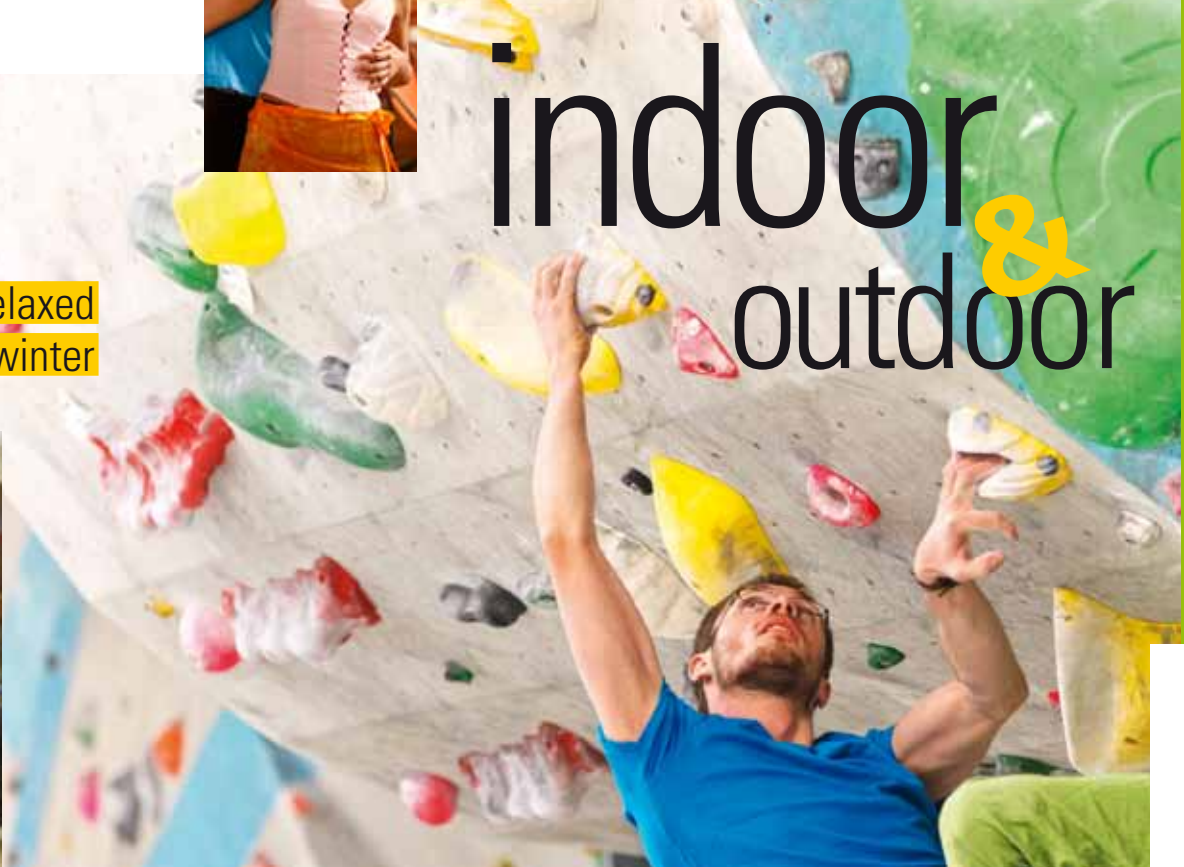

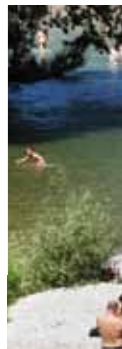

Sports in the City

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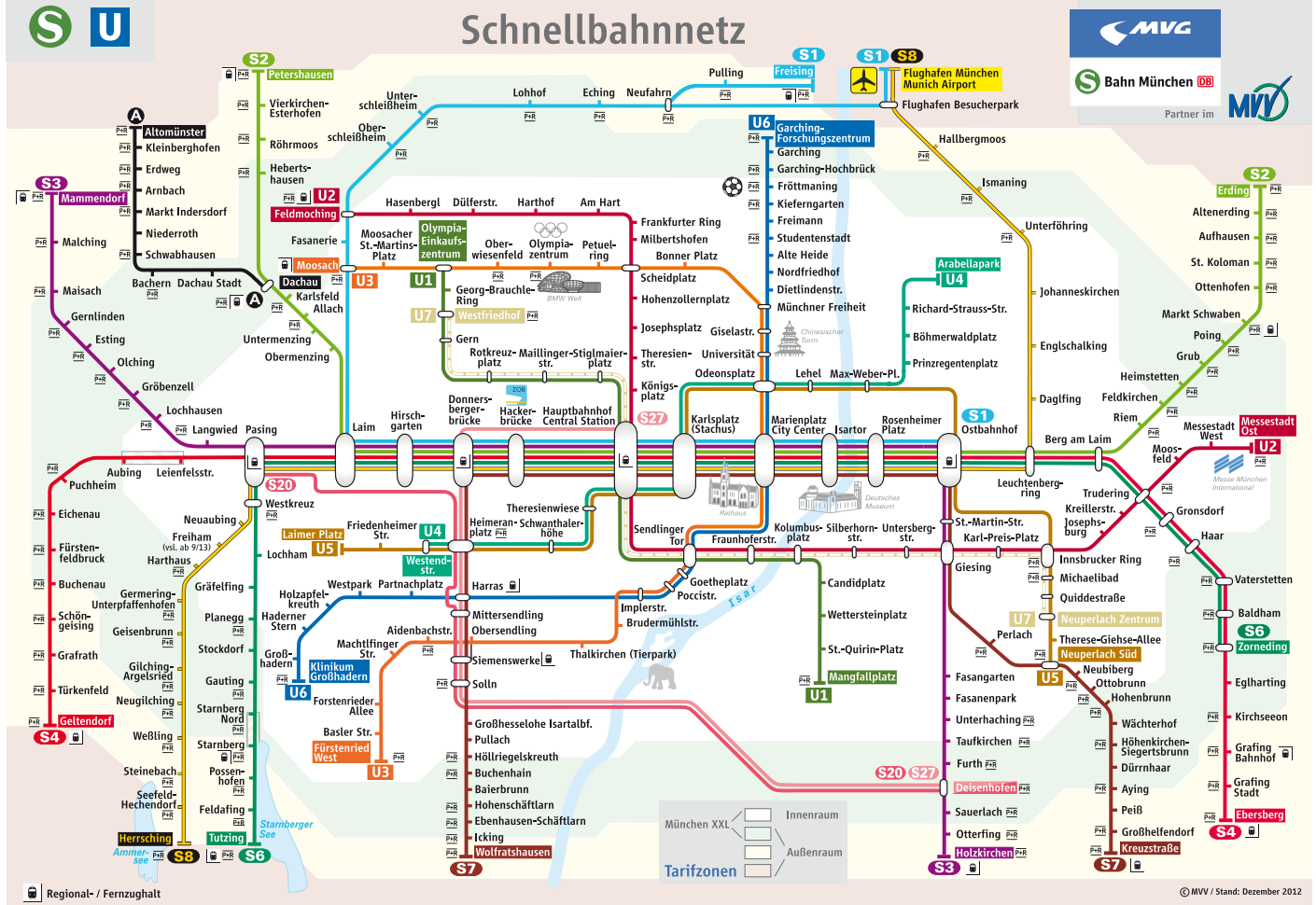
